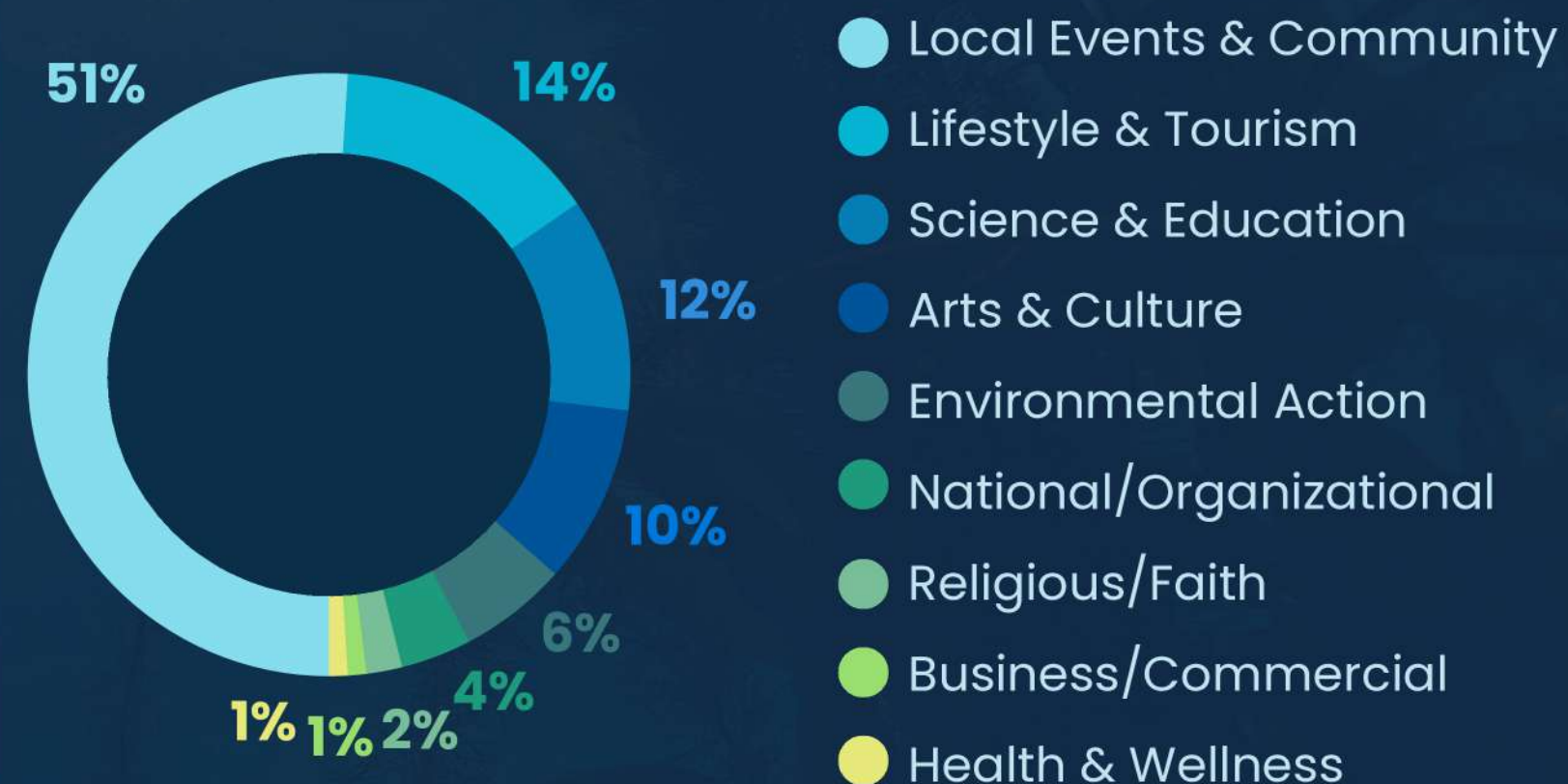
Media tell stories that help people understand their connection to the ocean and find opportunities to join in Ocean Week Canada. These stories have a powerful influence on ocean awareness and culture.
